What is community-based survivor advocacy?

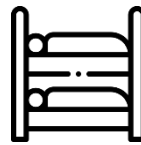
Individual survivor advocacy refers to free, supportive, confidential services provided to people who have experienced sexual violence, domestic violence, stalking, and/or other crimes. These services are intended to help survivors navigate the healing and/or criminal justice process.¹

Types of advocacy services



24-hour crisis and support hotline

A hotline phone number that is staffed 24 hours a day, 7 days a week by trained advocates who will talk to anyone in a domestic violence, sexual assault and/or stalking situation, offering support and access to resources as needed.



Emergency shelter

Temporary housing for individuals and families fleeing from an abusive situation. Generally located in a secure, confidential area, emergency shelters provide a safe space that can help facilitate the start of the healing process.



Transitional housing

Intended as a longer-term solution than emergency shelter, transitional housing programs provide survivors and their families with free or low-cost housing and services as an interim measure between temporary emergency shelter and acquiring stable long-term housing.



Support groups

Regularly-scheduled group meetings of advocates and survivors convened for the purposes of reducing feelings of isolation among survivors, dealing with the effects of abuse, and facilitating the overall healing process.

Types of advocacy services, continued



Legal advocacy

Legal advocacy services help survivors understand the process of applying for restraining orders, discuss how various legal options might impact a survivor's safety, connecting survivors to support groups and other services, and accompanying survivors to the courthouse in the event their restraining order application is contested. However, **legal advocacy is not legal advice!**



Economic empowerment

Many victims of domestic abuse are forced into financial dependence and even debt by their abuser, as another way for the abuser to exert power, control and entrapment. To help survivors help themselves, economic empowerment services can include providing survivors with basic money management education, individual development savings accounts (IDAs) and other forms of economic justice.



Services for children and youth

Any program that addresses the experiences of children and youth exposed to trauma, violence and abuse; often incorporates aspects of peer counseling, case management, play therapy, and a number of other practices. However, this is not considered day care.



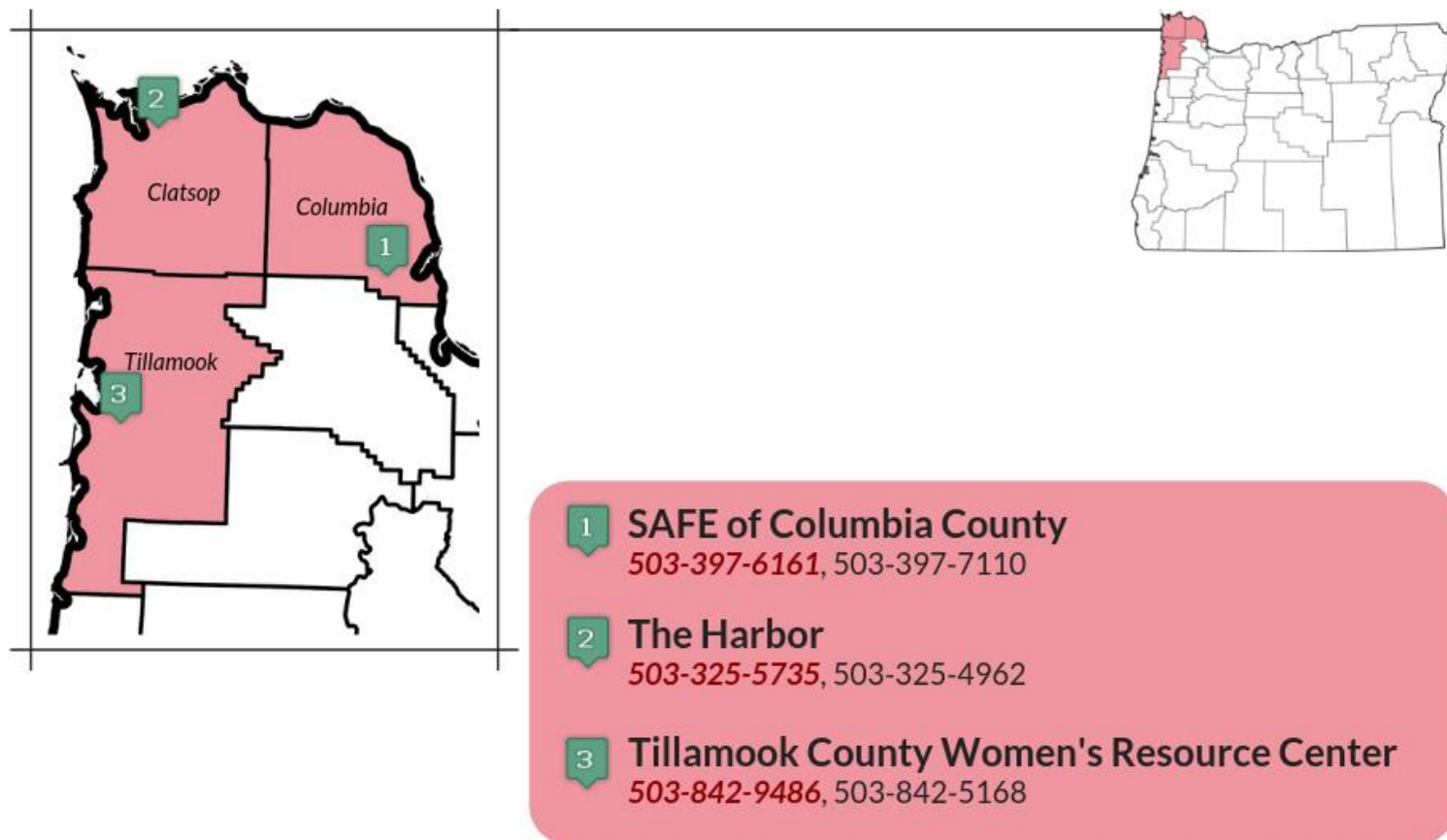
Counseling and therapy

Structured therapy sessions with a licensed mental health practitioner versed in working compassionately with survivors of abuse.



Prevention education

Multi-session educational initiatives, focused either on vulnerable populations or the larger community, to raise awareness about the issues of domestic violence, sexual assault, and stalking, with the goal of empowering survivors and increasing positive engagement of community members to reduce violence.

Non-advocacy service providers

Campus-based advocacy programs

A growing number of Oregon colleges and universities offer confidential advocacy and support resources for survivors of sexual assault and harassment.

In addition to being crimes, sexual harassment and sexual violence are kinds of sex discrimination that are prohibited by federal Title IX laws and other regulations.

All schools receiving federal student aid are required to have formal processes for receiving Title IX complaints, investigating them, and determining what action(s) the school administration will take in response.

Victim assistance programs

Most district attorneys' offices, some law enforcement agencies, and a few parole / probation offices operate Victim Assistance Programs (VAPs).

VAPs generally provide services to victims of crime in relation to criminal cases that are being prosecuted by the state. They do not provide support in civil legal proceedings (e.g. divorce, civil lawsuits).

Victim assistance is NOT the same as community-based advocacy.

Communications between survivors and victim assistance programs (VAPs) are not protected by state or federal advocate privilege and confidentiality laws.

Under certain circumstances, victim assistance programs may be required to share information with prosecutors or law enforcement.
