
Fatal Domestic Violence in Oregon: Demographics Related to Victims, Perpetrators, and Incidents

2016 Report





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Introduction

In 2016, Oregon lost 37 people in fatal domestic violence incidents. In this report, the Coalition has utilized a broad definition of domestic violence, including a wide variety of incidents that take place in the context of a family or household. We track incidents involving care providers, people related by blood or marriage including extended family, current and former intimate partners, the extended family of current and former intimate partners, and cases of prostitution (covered under the term intimate partner). The term victim as used in this report refers to any individual who was killed, sustained injury, or was otherwise involved in an episode of fatal domestic violence, including bystanders. You will find tables and graphs with data pertaining to all victims, and tables and graphs specifically providing data pertaining to victims who lost their lives (the header of these tables and graphs will refer to "victims killed"). Perpetrator data are provided in the same manner.

This report includes a section dedicated to intimate partner violence (IPV) fatalities that is identical in form to the larger report. The Coalition received feedback on the need for IPV-specific data to be presented separately due to some grant reporting requirements. You will find a broad look at IPV fatality incidents in the state, including in which counties they occurred, frequency per month, and types of incidents. This overview is followed by victim and perpetrator data, including age, gender, relationship, and manner of death. The IPV section concludes with location information.

Definitions

Domestic violence- a pattern of coercive tactics that can include physical, psychological, sexual, economic, and/or emotional abuse, perpetrated by one person against a family member, intimate partner, or person in their care, with the goal of establishing and maintaining power and control.


Intimate partner violence- a pattern of coercive tactics that can include physical, psychological, sexual, economic, and/or emotional abuse, perpetrated by one person against a current or former intimate partner, with the goal of establishing and maintaining power and control. It is a subcategory of domestic violence.

Victim- any individual who was killed, sustained injury, or was otherwise involved in an episode of fatal domestic violence, including bystanders.


Overview: Domestic Violence Incidents across Oregon

A total of 37 people—victims and perpetrators—lost their lives in 2016.


Thirteen out of thirty-six Oregon counties had at least one fatal domestic-violence incident.



The state suffered a **total of 30** separate incidents of fatal domestic violence, with the highest number concentrated in Multnomah County.



The highest number of fatal DV incidents in a one-month period occurred in May.


Out of a total of forty-four victims, 57% were killed. Of twenty-eight female victims, 57% were killed. Of fifteen male victims, 60% were killed.







Narrative Summaries by County

Clackamas Lake Oswego- A woman fatally shot her estranged husband in

his home.

Oregon City- A woman fatally shot her husband in their home.

They were in the process of getting a divorce.

Milwaukie- A man fatally shot an acquaintance and

attempted to shoot his ex-wife in their home.

Columbia

St. Helens- A man kidnapped his girlfriend and strangled her to death with the assistance of two accomplices.

Coos

Coos Bay- A man bludgeoned his uncle to death in their

home.

Deschutes

La Pine- A man shot his son and then fatally shot his son's girlfriend before fatally shooting himself in his home. The son survived.

Terrebonne- A man killed his wife before killing himself by driving his car off a cliff.

Jackson

Applegate- A man killed his girlfriend in his home.

Applegate- A woman fatally shot her uncle in his home. He had previously been charged with assault and harassment.

Klamath

Klamath Falls- A woman fatally strangled her boyfriend in their home.

Bonanza- A man fatally shot his brother following an altercation.

Keno- A teenager stabbed his grandmother to death at her home.

Lane

Eugene- A man murdered his girlfriend before dumping her body in a remote area of Klamath County.

Eugene- A man fatally stabbed his girlfriend at his residence.

Marion

Salem- A man fatally stabbed his mother in her home while his younger siblings were present.

Keizer- A teenager fatally stabbed his mother's boyfriend in self-defense.

Salem- A man broke into his ex-girlfriend's home and fatally shot her. She had a restraining order against him.

Multnomah

Portland- A man shot his estranged girlfriend before fatally shooting himself. She survived.

Gresham- A woman fatally struck her husband with a car.

Portland- A man fatally stabbed his girlfriend in their home and attempted to cut himself fatally, but he survived.

Gresham- Police were called to a domestic violence situation involving a couple and fatally shot the perpetrator.

Portland- A man fatally shot his girlfriend.

Troutdale- A man fatally shot his wife before fatally shooting himself at their home.

Portland- A woman fatally stabbed her boyfriend at her apartment.

Polk

Salem- Police fatally shot a man following an incident in which he had been harassing his ex-girlfriend and threatening another person with a knife.

Tillamook

Pacific City- A man fatally shot his wife before fatally shooting himself in their home.

Umatilla

Milton-Freewater- A man stabbed his children and fatally stabbed his wife before attempting to fatally stab himself. The perpetrator and the children survived.

Hermiston- A man shot his ex-girlfriend (who survived) and fatally shot her son and current boyfriend before fatally shooting himself.

Washington


King City- A man fatally shot his wife when she was dropping their child off for a visit at his parents' house. The man then shot a responding police officer (who survived) and was shot and killed by other police officers.


Tualatin- Police fatally shot a man attempting to break into his neighbor's house with a gun in pursuit of two family members who had fled there.

2016 IPV Supplement




