OCADSV Annual Conference, 2023

### October 30th- November 1st | Sunriver, Oregon

The Oregon Coalition Against Domestic & Sexual Violence (OCADSV) is seeking conference workshop proposals from dynamic, knowledgeable presenters with a robust understanding of the dynamics of domestic violence, sexual assault, and stalking in regard to survivor-centered intervention, advocacy, and prevention.

Past conferences have had over 200 participants attend, including domestic and sexual violence advocates and other agency staff; local, state and federal government employees; and numerous community partners from the healthcare, military, law enforcement, corrections, K-12 and higher education, social services, and mental health fields.

OCADSV is dedicated to the continuous growth of advocacy skills. The annual conference has a goal to create new ways of supporting survivors. How do we as an anti-violence community adapt to the needs of our state? Through creativity, we are able to communicate more effectively with one another about the complex networks we exist in, and we are able to further explore solutions that may not have seemed possible in the past.

OCADSV is looking for innovative workshops that explore our field with new perspectives.

All proposed workshops <u>must</u>:

- Be designed for experienced practitioners (no \*beginner-level content); and
- Incorporate **interactive and participatory** workshop facilitation methods.
- <u>Be able to be instructed virtually pending COVID-19 guidance</u>

Additional consideration will be given to workshop proposals that:

- Substantively cover material **within one or more priority topic areas** (see page 2);
- Provide attendees with tangible knowledge/skills/tools/practices; and/or
- Feature multi-lingual and multi-cultural presenters for workshops **conducted in languages other than English.**

## A. Priority topic areas

- Violence Prevention
- Domestic/Sexual Violence Intervention
- Nonprofit Leadership Community-Based Advocacy Agencies
- Liberatory Wellness
  - The Oregon Coalition is aware of the systemic challenges that impact the wellness of our organizations, communities, and our bodies. Often survivors themselves, advocate staff have been depleted of energy and emotional capacity as they navigate legislative uncertainty. We are excited to offer this new wellness track to support the health and wellness of advocates, directors, and community members.

Successful liberatory wellness track workshop proposals:

- may offer space for attendees to practice rest and self care skills
- may address how program leadership discusses restoration needs with staff, increase capacity, and explore creative ways to implement policy to meet staff needs.
- will be mindful of the broad and systemic impact of implicit biases around health, size, ability, race, class, etc.
- will intentionally include conversations around the specific wellness needs of communities impacted by implicit bias in western care models.

#### B. Compensation

<b>For each 90-minute standard workshop</b> that is accepted, OCADSV will provide:	<b>For each 180-minute deep-dive workshop</b> that is accepted, OCADSV will provide:
<ul> <li>\$120 per workshop;</li> <li>One (1) standard double-occupancy guestroom for one (1) night at Sunriver Resort per workshop; and</li> <li>Registration fee waivers for each presenter for the day of their presentation.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>\$240 per workshop;</li> <li>One (1) standard double-occupancy guestroom for two (2) nights at Sunriver Resort per workshop; and</li> <li>Registration fee waivers for each presenter for the entire conference.</li> </ul>

\*Beginner-level, or 101 content, includes any foundational training that professionals in S/DV work should have already learned as a basic function of their role, such as basic advocacy or management skills. Our conference seeks to build new knowledge among Oregon's advocates.
